This program will focus on the key provisions of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act of 2004, emphasizing the changes from IDEA 97.

You will learn about the history of special education law, the Congressional Findings and Purposes, and their impact on evaluations, IEPs, and new procedural requirements. You will learn about new requirements for the “Due Process Complaint Notice” and “Resolution (IEP) Session.”

You will learn about the implications of the recent U.S. Supreme Court decision in ***Schaffer v. Weast*** and how that decision may shift the balance of power in meetings and due process hearings. You will learn about ***Arlington School District v. Murphy***, the law case about fees for experts or consultants that will be decided by the U.S. Supreme Court later this year.
