When I read the USDOE's publication "Teacher Quality Guide Supports Parents' Right to Know" in the February 1 issue of *The Achiever: No Child Left Behind Newsletter*, I learned that I am entitled to information about Jennifer's teachers, including:

- (1) Whether the teacher has met State qualification and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction;
- (2) Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which State qualification or licensing criteria have been waived.
- (3) The baccalaureate degree major of the teacher and any other graduate certification or degree held by the teacher, and the field of discipline of the certification or degree.
- (4) Whether the child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications.

I am requesting this information about the qualifications of Jennifer's teachers and paraprofessional. I believe the information will help me work more effectively with her teachers. I am enclosing a copy of The Achiever. Some of the articles in this and future issues may be of interest to you and your staff.
