The Education for Parents of Indian Children with Special Needs (EPICS) staff, board of directors and partners are please to announce the 9th Annual Family Leadership Academy (formerly known as Annual Parent Leadership Institute). He appeared as the parent's attorney in the award-wining DVD video, Surviving Due Process: When Parents and the School Board Disagree- Stephen Jeffers v. School Board (2004). Pete and Pam Wright are Adjunct Professors of Law at the Williams and Mary Law School where they teach a course about special education law and advocacy and assist with the Law School's Special Education Law Clinic. 
