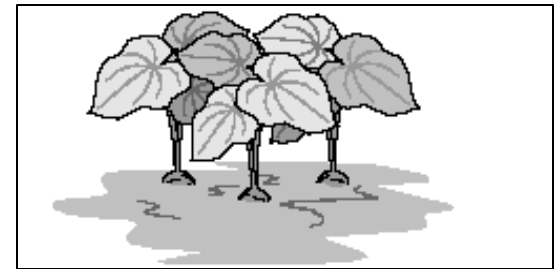

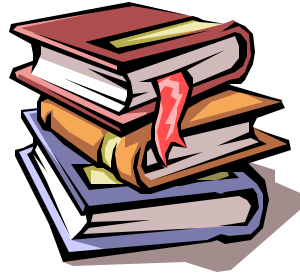
## Ho`ona`auao
