

Peter W.D. Wright, Esq.

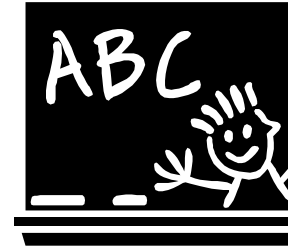
